

[Koychev & Moutafov, 2000], c) Mint of a settlement at the mouth of the river Adiras on the Propontis (Sea of Marmara) between the poleis Selymbria and Byzantion [Topalov, 2005], d) An ancient settlement is known in this region by the name of Άθηρα on the river Aθήρας, hoewever, the Greek name of the settlement does not contain the letter  $\Delta$  !".
