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The Harry M. Eisenhower Collection

Some of the most remarkable collections are built by the collectors and researchers that give back to the hobby most. Harry M. Eisenhower is no exception. Harry specialized in Canadian Chartered Banknotes, with a particular focus on the Eastern Provinces of Canada. Over 50 years of collecting, he was able to acquire some of the most spectacular rarities from Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, and Prince Edward Island.

Harry started collecting at the age of nine in 1947. He was drawn to the engravings on stamps, naturally leading to an interest in Canadian banknotes. He ardently shared his passion with others, serving fellow collectors and advancing the hobby through his activities in numismatics. He is Life Member No. 16 of the Canadian Paper Money Society, and served as the first Vice President and Membership Director, later serving as President. He also served as President and a founding member in the Atlantic Provinces Numismatic Association and Fredericton Numismatic Society. Beyond numismatics, Harry is a founding patron of the J. Douglas Ferguson Education and Research Foundation, and Farmers Bank of Rustico Museum.

Education was important to Harry, as he served as a frequent speaker, convention chairman and moderator of many an educational symposium at local, regional, and national events. Harry lent a hand to Bob Graham, contributing significantly to the Canadian Paper Money Society Note Registry for more than 30 years. His notes were listed, and are undoubtedly on want lists for many a specialists, waiting for this offering today. Harry also served as a contributor to the Charlton catalogs, both for research and market pricing. His lifelong endeavors have earned him honorary life memberships in The Halifax Regional Coin Club, Ingersoll Coin Club, and Prince Edward Island Numismatic Association. In 1973, he was awarded the Dale Garland Award.

Harry helped shape Canadian banknote collecting, and we owe him a great debt of gratitude. Today's offering is the first time that many collectors will have a chance to compete for Chartered banknote rarities, and the conditions of the representative survivors are in many cases, unequalled.

His penchant for banknotes began as he encountered the varied circulating currencies from travels around the world, each time bringing circulating examples home with him. His traveling pursuits are a serious endeavor, having tallied visits to 132 countries, including locales that are nearly inaccessible due to politics or sheer remoteness. Few globetrotters have logged the travels Yuri has, including North Korea, Kiribati, Congo Democratic Republic, Central African Republic, Federated States of Micronesia, Burkina Faso, and most recently, Papua New Guinea and East Timor. The understanding of the cultures and experiences in travel make collecting world banknotes a perfect complement to a life of adventurous travel.

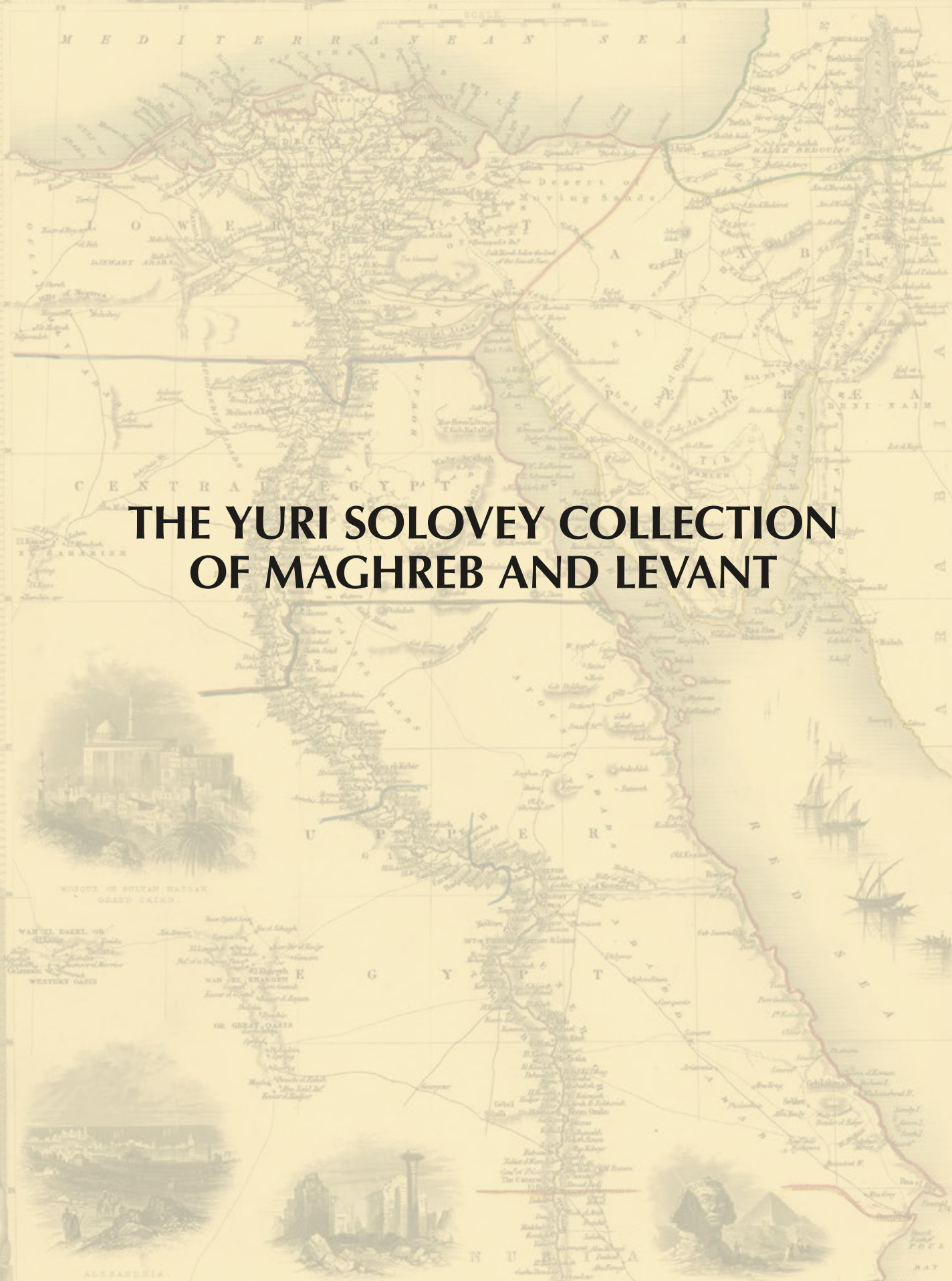

A pleasing pair of types, one in issued form and one in Specimen form. The small sized 5 Francs has mildly toned paper, while the large format Specimen is problem free. Both types are quite pleasing, with handsome French Colonial designs.

Of interest, this specific example is a color trial, with deep blue tones on the front (in lieu of black), and is certainly extremely rare as such. Totally original paper is noted on this lightly handled, large format note. Specimens were known to have been created for dates in 1904, 1906, 1909, 1910, and 1912. This trial example is without a date, signatures, and serial numbers. Printer notations and a perforated cancellation are noted on this pristine example. A top notch rarity and a simply stunning Color Trial Specimen. The first we have offered and the first to be offered since 2012.

Suffice to say, most Egypt collectors could only dream to be able to include any examples of the first series in their collections, and for the lucky few who can, Specimen are most likely the only format that they would be able to acquire. The first issue was convertible to gold, and the face value on this Pick represented an astronomical amount. Beautifully printed, the face depicts Trajan's Kiosk on the Island of Philae, and guilloche patterns on the back. Mismatched serials, and cancelled perforated. This example places second highest on the PMG census of only six graded. Understandably, this Specimen was previously mounted, as indicated on the holder.

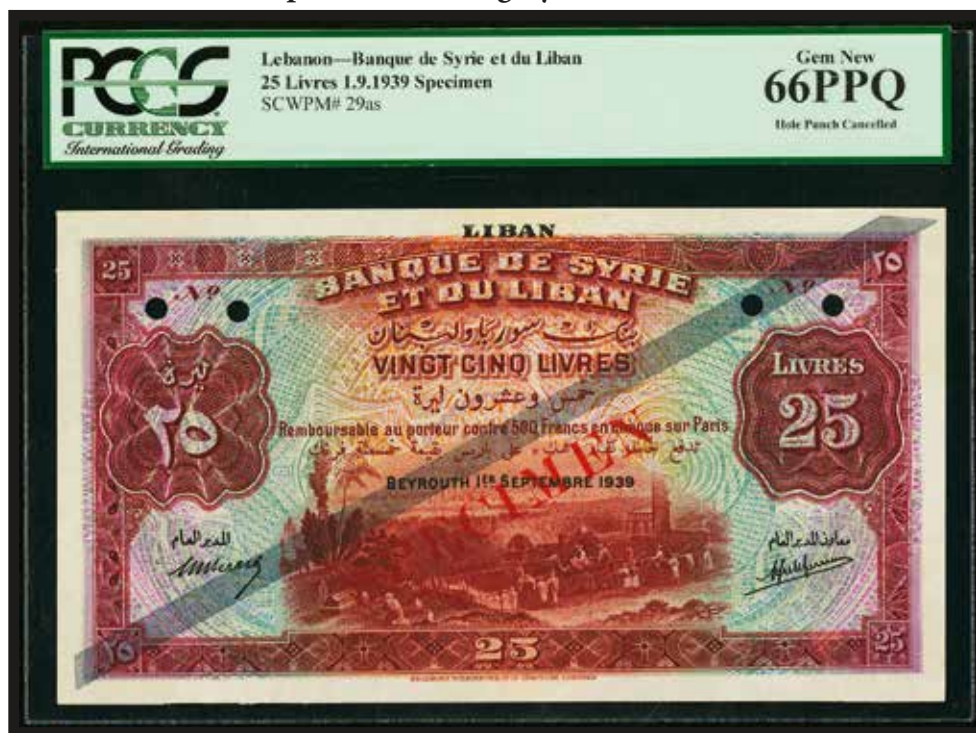

Provisional Album of Afghanistan Bank Notes



28201 Afghanistan- Da Afghanistan Bank Provisional Album of Bank Notes.

During the height of the Russian-Afghan War, diplomatic envoys were frequent between Moscow and Kabul, especially for Babrak Karmal and his staff. Karmal was installed President of Afghanistan by the Russians shortly after the invasion in 1979. In a 1983 visit, President Karmal and his envoy met with Andrei Gromyko, the Russian Minister of Foreign Affairs and they presented this album to him as a gift. On the inside cover is the inscription:

Dr. Mehraboddin Paktiawal was the head of the Da Afghanistan Bank and was part of the diplomatic envoy. His presentation of this album as a gift was done a little less formally. The notes range from the first Afghan 1919-1920 Treasury issues through 1358 (1979) Specimens printed by the bank just a few years before the visit. The first page features a printed logo of Da Afghanistan Bank, measuring approximately 9 cm x 8.5 cm. The provisional or informal album lends to the theory that this was a gift among friends and geared towards Gromyko's collecting interests over a formal gift of the state. The following notes are included in the album, with a few notes hand selected for third party grading:

Treasury 1919-1920 Issues; Pick 1a, 1b, (2) 1b with counterfoil attached, 2a, and 4, all average circulated to AU.

Kingdom - Post Rebellion 1936 Issues; Pick 15, 16, 16A, 17, 17A, all choice AU to Choice Uncirculated.

Kingdom - Post Rebellion 1936 Issues; Pick 18A PMG 53 (ink on face), 18r PMG 65 EPQ, Pick 19A PMG 53 (ink, paper pull and tear), 19r PMG 67 EPQ, 20A PMG 53 (ink and tear), 20r PMG 66 EPQ.

Bank of Afghanistan 1939 Issues; Pick 25a, 25a, 26, 34b, all About Uncirculated.

Bank of Afghanistan 1961-63 Issues; Pick 37s hole cancelled, 38s, 39s hole cancelled, 40s hole cancelled, 40As hole cancelled, 41s, 42s, 42s hold cancelled. All grade AU to Choice Uncirculated with SPECIMEN printed in red or black diagonally on the front and back of each piece.

Bank of Afghanistan SH1346 (1967) Issues; Pick 43s, 44s, 45s, 46, and 46s. Each grades AU to Choice Uncirculated with SPECIMEN overprinted in red diagonally on the Specimens.

Bank of Afghanistan SH1352 (1973) Issues; Pick 47s, 48s, 49s, 50s, 51s, 53s. Grades range from AU to Gem Uncirculated, with SPECIMEN overprinted in red diagonally on the face and back of each note.

Bank of Afghanistan SH1358 (1979) Issues; Pick 55s, 56s, 57s, 58s, 59s, 61s. Grades range from AU to Gem Uncirculated, with SPECIMEN overprinted in red diagonally on the face and back of each note.

The cold and dry climate in Russia was perfect for storage with no ill-effects seen on any of the notes from storage in the album. In person inspection is highly recommended.

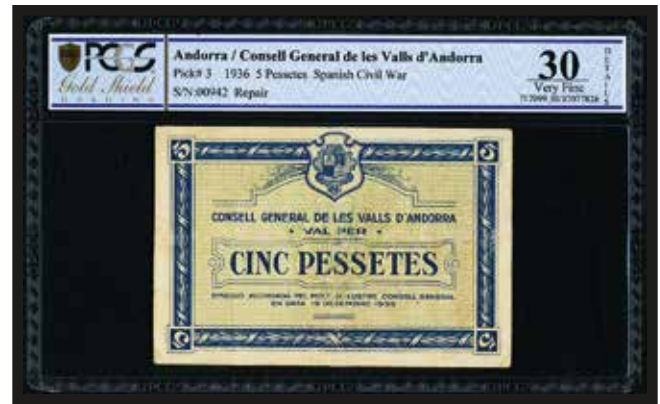

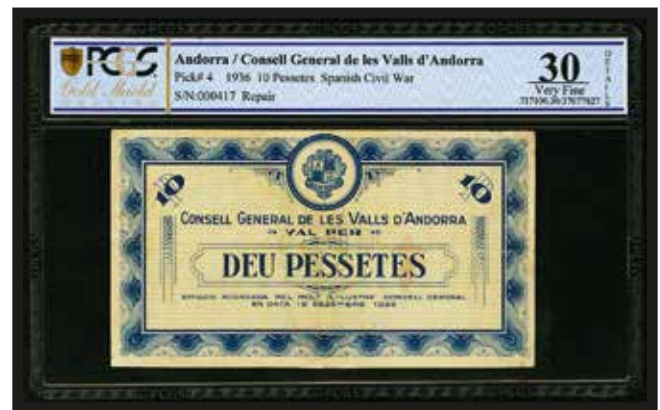

Matthew Flinders, the navigator and cartographer, on the face, who also renamed New Holland to Australia. This is the first time that we have offered this variety, and is genuinely rare. For British Commonwealth collectors and enthusiasts, the 1965 Bahamas series is one of the most prized. The engravings are beautiful, the portrait of Queen Elizabeth II is stately, and rarity of the highest denominations keeps the hunt alive to complete this series. The \$50 denomination has been a key denomination from its inception to the present day. Interestingly, the old Bahamas sterling series ended with a 5 Pound note, which was redeemable for about \$15 in this new series, and the old and new currency schemes circulated simultaneously for 6 months in 1966. The scarcity of the \$20, \$50, and \$100 denominations is easy to imagine, as these notes represented substantial buying power in a country where, frankly, only a small percentage of the population could afford to hold such capital in banknotes. Thankfully for this \$50, a examples were saved for collectors to enjoy today. This specific example is the plate note for the Bahamas chapter of *The Banknote Book*. An important QEII note that is seldom seen in any grade. The "A" prefix was used in the 1965, 1968, and 1974 series of \$50 notes, which indicates how few of each were actually printed and introduced into circulation. Simply, a superb banknote, especially in this elite grade.

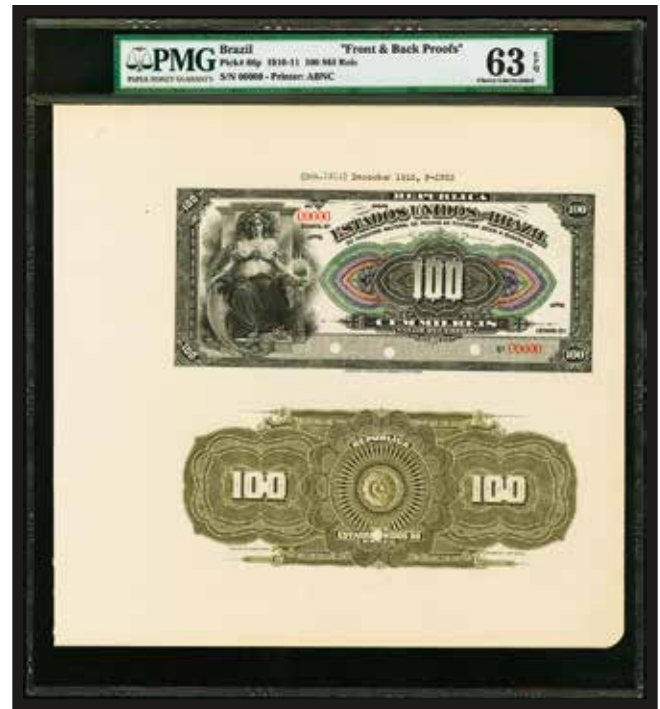

Pack fresh quality \$100 notes with the original hair design are quite scarce, let alone with Gem designation, as so many Bank of Canada notes are notoriously miscut. This example is eminently collectible in such a handsome grade.

As is sometimes the case in this always interesting banknote hobby, a fascinating rarity surfaces from the clear blue sky. While this may seem an ordinary Bank of Canada Modified Portrait \$2 note, it is anything but. During the signature periods of Beattie-Rasminsky and Lawson-Bouey, the Bank of Canada treated a few random batches of notes before releasing them into circulation. The mysterious treatment was some sort of paper upgrade intended to improve the durability of these notes, which had not much changed in the previous decades. The Charlton Standard Catalog acknowledges that only recently, a small batch of E/R prefix notes, 3744001-3872000 totaling 128,000 were created as the first test notes. As of 2012, only two E/R prefix test notes were reported in collectors' possessions. This example has moderate circulation, as the Bank of Canada had intended. But instead of being returned to the bank for analysis, this innocuous note was saved, accidentally or purposefully. The result is the same, and this incredible rarity could possibly be the first auctioned publicly with the E/R prefix and the finest surviving example known. Minor margin tears are mentioned, which could go to prove that the enhanced test notes may not have been much better than the ordinary notes. Nevertheless, a great Queen Elizabeth II and Bank of Canada rarity that is assuredly missing from even the best collections. Not to be missed.

A classic British Commonwealth rarity, known almost exclusively in Specimen form. 200 Shillings was an enormous sum of money in 1920s Africa, and the overwhelming majority of these issued examples were redeemed. East Africa used silver coinage until 1947, and during that time period, many of these notes were exchanged for specie, which was more liquid especially outside the currency union of Kenya, British Somaliland, Uganda, Tanganyika, and Zanzibar. By the 1960s, any outstanding 200 Shillings notes ran the risk of losing its value, as the East African Currency Board actively tried to have these old notes exchanged for newer issues, which further limited the amount of these high denominations in private hands. The above offering is exceptionally original and choice. The capital of East Africa was Mombasa at the time, which is a humid, tropical port city on the Indian Ocean, which is why any Mombasa issued example is usually seen with frail, limp paper. Not the case here, as crisp paper and original colors are easily seen through the third party holder. A key note for the King George V portrait series of banknotes, as well as for the African and Commonwealth realms.

The rise in British Commonwealth coins and banknotes over the past decade has brought to light some exceptional items, and here we have an offering that should impress and astonish even the most seasoned hobby professionals. Valued only as "Rare" in the Standard Catalog, this denomination is only infrequently found in Specimen Form, but this fully issued example may be one of the single greatest East African banknotes extant. Of the highest degree of rarity, this A/1 prefix issued note has a minuscule serial number 33 to boot. This denomination was most certainly printed in very small batches, as the overwhelming majority transactions in the colony were serviced by any of the smaller denominations. According to Linzmayer's *The Banknote Book: East Africa*, all but 222 of these issued notes were redeemed by the Currency Board by 1965. This figure seems unusually high, but it does not include notes destroyed by smaller banks during independence. As East Africa became Somalia, Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania, individual currency issuers exchanged any surviving examples. Bold original colors and paper are seen through the third party holder. PMG mentions it was previously mounted, which will not deter bidders, as rarity trumps any minor issue this improbable survivor might have. At the time of cataloging, there is only one other example graded in the PMG Population Report. Simply, in a word: outstanding!

After Germany's defeat, the Allies demanded all currency to be stamped by relevant authorities, or be rendered worthless. This example is the only graded example on the PMG Population Report, and there is nil sales history. Rare, and a great piece of history. Spindle holes, trimmed, and ink are noted.

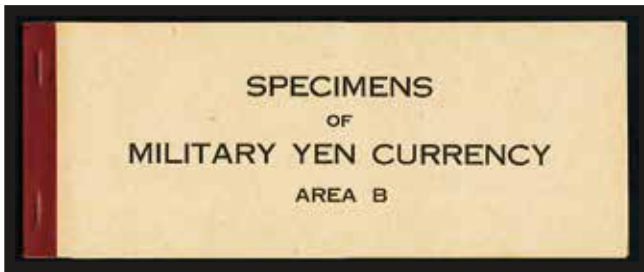

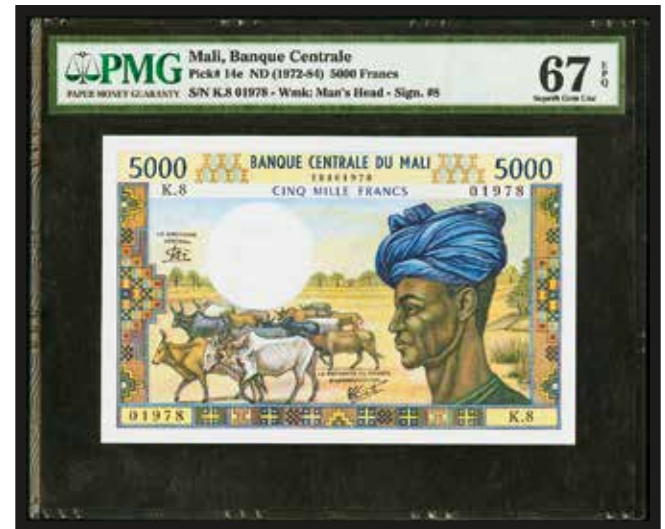

Napoleonic Era Rijksdaalder Set Rarity in Superb Condition

In January 1808, Herman Willem Daendels arrived in Batavia as new Governor General of the Netherlands East Indies. The time of the VOC was over and its successor, the Council for Asian Possessions and Establishments, had been abolished by decree of the King of Holland on July 29, 1806. Daendels was sent out by the Minister of Commerce and Colonies to administer, along with the Council of the Indies in Batavia, the King's possessions in the East Indies.

His prospects were not very favorable. The island of Java had become completely isolated. There was plenty of merchandise; the warehouses were, in fact, overcrowded, but merchant shipping was completely blocked. Stagnation of the revenues led to a lack of funds for the government, which was particularly problematic. Daendels could not afford to limit spending because the island was too fortified for defensive purposes. Moreover, the government had fixed financial obligations, such as the payment for coffee and other goods that the natives grew for the government.

One way to get funds was to create paper money. This had already happened earlier in the Dutch East Indies. Daendels also tried to obtain cash through the sale of domain goods. In 1809 and 1810, for example, he sold the areas around Tenggeran, Karawang, and Bantam (and some smaller areas) to private individuals. Later in 1810 he focused on Java's Oosthoek where there were a number of lands that generated relatively little money for the government. For example, the districts of Bezoekie and Panaroekan were previously leased for only 9,000 Rds ("rijksdaalders", the money of account) per year to Han Chanpit, the "Captain of the Chinese" of Surabaya. Han bought the two areas for 400,000 Spanish dollars (533,333 Rds). He assumed over 508,959 Rds in debt from the government and paid 24,374 Rds in cash.

The next step was the Probolinggo Regency, which contained large tracts of unexplored fertile land but did not generate much income for the government (2,000 Spanish dollars in recognition fees, 70 koyans [a unit of weight] of rice, and 140 Spanish dollars for 14 leased bird nest caves a year). In East Java, the family of Han Chanpit was actually the only one rich enough to pay for this piece of land at the time and so it was offered to him first. He was willing to pay 600,000 Spanish dollars (800,000 Rds), but could not raise that amount quickly. Negotiations were then started with his brother Han Tikko, the "Captain of the Chinese" from Pasoeroean.ii It turned out that he was willing to pay a million Rds, but only in twenty half-yearly installments, spread over a period of ten years. The deal was guaranteed by a mortgage not only on the property of Probolinggo itself, but also on the areas that Han Chanpit had acquired Besoekie and Panaroekan.

Daendels accepted this offer. In order to generate cash in the short term, he created paper money in the amount of one million rijksdaalders that was to circulate in East Java as "silver money." With each repayment by Han Tikko, one twentieth of this paper money could be exchanged for silver coin, with the entire issue of notes being completely withdrawn and redeemed in ten years.

This "Probolingo credit paper" was put into circulation by a decree of December 3, 1810. It was stated that the following number of notes would be issued:

The notes were signed by the members of the Council of India W. van Hoesen and J. C. Romswinkel, by Administrator C. W. Thalman and Recipient General R. Coop à Groen, and finally for "gezien" (oversight) by the Director General of Finance and Domains P. Chassé. The notes were declared legal tender in the districts of Java's Oosthoek and Java's Noord-Oostkust for their face value in silver money, and severe penalties were enacted for those who would not accept it as the equivalent of silver coin or who would charge a discount to accept it.

Every half year, one twentieth of the value of the entire issue was to be retired, at the end of April, and at the end of November. For each denomination, starting with the highest value, lottery tickets with the serial numbers of the circulating notes were deposited in a container. Orphan boys were designated to pull the desired number of tickets from the container and then selected numbers were published. The owners of the notes with these drawn serial numbers were to then be invited to return them to one of the offices in Java for silver money. After this, the exchanged notes were to be burned in public in Batavia.

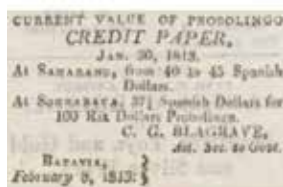
The first payment by Han Tikko was set at the end of June 1811. The first lottery, covering one twentieth of the issue value of all Probolingo paper took place on May 31, 1811. The drawn serial numbers were announced and published in the *Bataviasche Koloniale Courant*. The time set to exchange these selected notes for silver coin was set to begin on July 1, 1811.

However, the political situation was changing rapidly. On February 17, 1811, the news reached Java that the Netherlands had been incorporated into France. Daendels now served on behalf of the French government for a short time, but was replaced by J.W. Janssens as Governor General in May 1811. A few months later, Java passed into English hands. The British army landed at Chillingching on August 4, 1811 and forced the island to capitulate on September 18, 1811. The administration of the island was now in the hands of Lieutenant General Thomas Stamford Raffles.

The lottery drawing for serial numbers of Probolingo banknotes to be withdrawn in the fall of 1811 was added. However, on February 29, 1812, the first issue of the Java Government Gazette appeared. It contained the publication of a decree of February 14, 1812, announcing how the new regime would proceed with the redemption of the Probolingo credit notes.

To begin with, the English regime confirmed the agreement between Daendels and Han Tikko. It announced that the second draw of the Probolingo bank note serial numbers would take place on March 1, 1812, in front of a committee consisting of the President of the Supreme Court, the Secretary of the Government, the Accountant, and the Vice Treasurer.

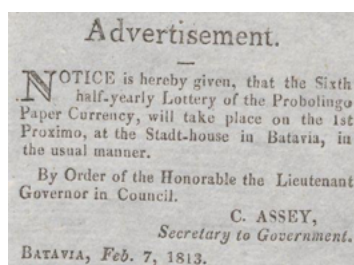
Lieutenant General Raffles, however, scrapped the rule that the notes had to always be accepted as silver money without a discount. The Probolingo notes remained legal tender in the two eastern districts of Java, both between private individuals and upon acceptance by the government greenhouses in Samarang and Surabaya. However, moving forward, it was quoted at a rate that was periodically recalculated and published to the public. The authorities in the two capitals were to report every Saturday what the average rate of the notes had been in the preceding week, so that the value for the coming week could be determined.

These current rates of the Probolingo notes were published regularly in the *Gazette*. The first statement that was found, however, only dates from June 6, 1812. Initially, the exchange rate was specified as the number of Spanish dollars per 100 Rds of Probolingo notes. However, on November 1, 1813, it was decided that from January 1, 1814, the Javanese rupee would replace the Spanish dollar as the standard currency of Java, so that from that date all amounts would be expressed in rupees. There was, however, a delay in implementing this. The published daily exchange rate of the Probolingo paper was not expressed in rupees until June 1814, and first in Surabaya and then in Samarang (NB At that time the rupee was valued at 30 stuivers, while the dollar was valued at 66 stuivers). These daily rate specifications are found in the *Gazette* between June 6, 1812 and August 12, 1815, but only sporadically in the last year. During this period the exchange rate (as specified by the English government) remained fairly stable and fluctuated between 35 and 45 Spanish dollars per 100 Rds (see Appendix 1).

In the meantime, the semi-annual draws under English rule took place at the town hall of Batavia every spring and autumn. For the exchange, the country's treasuries in Surabaya and Samarang were designated, the principal places of the districts where the paper was legal tender. From the fourth draw, the English regime, especially for owners living in Batavia, offered the possibility of obtaining the value of their Probolingo notes in treasury notes in Batavia.

In 1813, the circulation of the Probolingo notes seems to have come to an end. In Probolingo, which was sold to Han Tikko, a rebellion broke out in May 1813, allegedly because of its strict and sometimes unjust rule. The insurgents killed Han Tikko and two English officers who were visiting him at the time, and plundered the city of Probolingo. This was followed by an army of no less than 800 men coming from Surabaya to destroy the rebels. Han Tikko's descendants could not meet his financial obligations and Probolingo returned to Government ownership.

Raffles, the English administrator, then proposed that since the payments that formed the basis for issuing the credit notes had ceased, all Probolingo bills would be redeemable in 6% interest-bearing Government treasury bills. The exchange rate of the Probolingo paper was to be the highest quoted daily rate at the time that Han Tikko died, namely 40 Spanish dollars for 100 Rds. The exchange offer was announced in Batavia, Samarang, and Surabaya between September 1 and October 1, 1813.iii However, it appears that several holders of the paper were not inclined to make use of this offer. It was therefore announced in October 1813 that the semi-annual raffles would continue as usual.iv

A few months after the tenth draw, on August 16, 1816, Java was returned to the Dutch government. This takeover did not change the obligations that were in place regarding the Probolingo notes. Publications of the daily rate were no longer found in the newspaper. The government postponed the eleventh draw for half a year so that on July 2, 1817 a double amount of tickets was drawn.

Under the new regime, the president and two members of the Court of Auditors oversaw the draws on behalf of the government. After each draw, a notice appeared in the newspaper to advise when and where the drawn serial numbers could be exchanged. Direct redemption in Batavia was also possible beginning with the thirteenth draw.

The nineteenth draw on September 30, 1820 was the last of the series. After this, on March 22, 1821, it was simply determined that the remaining Probolingo notes (without specifying their numbers) were considered as having been drawn and could not be redeemed after April 15, 1821.

Some Probolingo bills were in the news for special reason. In the Java Government Gazette of February 13, 1813, there was an advertisement from one Z. van Hek who reported that two Probolingo bills, namely 300 Rds D 66 and 100 Rds F 283, had been stolen from him. He warned the public not to accept these notes and asked the Treasurer not to pay them out in the event of a possible lottery. A few years later, another bill, 200 Rds E 222, also appeared to be discredited. On March 16, 1819, the Chief Financial Officer called on the owners of these three notes to report within three months with evidence that they had received the notes fairly and without sufficient evidence, they would lose any compensation rights. Ticket 100 Rds F 283 was drawn in October 1820; any information about the actual redemption of this note is unknown.

Appendix 2. The dates of the serial number lottery of the Probolingo notes. The first two columns show the number and date of the draw; in the third the issue of the Bataviasche Colonial Courant (BKC), the Java Government Gazette (JGG) or the Bataviasche Courant (BC) in which the serial numbers were published; and in the fourth column the place (S & S: Samarang & Surabaya; B: Batavia) and date on which the exchange of the notes began.

The notes

In the course of 1821, the vast majority of the Probolingo notes must have disappeared from circulation. It appears, however, that the burning of the notes did not always take place. A portion of the notes probably ended up in an archive (in Samarang?), and a number of them must have been put on the market at a later date. It seems they were offered in groups of all six denominations. As a result, the higher values are now not rarer than the lower values, despite their more limited edition. Since the groups were first released to collectors, some have been broken up.

The general description of the tickets is as follows:

The paper is provided with a watermark, either the text **LYDIG & MESTER** or a crowned oval shield in which a figure (a soldier with a feathered helmet?) is holding a spear with freedom hat and a three-leaf flower.

The printed text, framed on three sides is:

Litt a [A. t/m F.] N°. Goed voor Rijksdaalders [of Rijksd:] [1000. t/m 100.]

Zegge [duizend t/m honderd] Rijksdaalders.

Begrepen onder de somme van één millioen Rijksdaalders zilver geld, waar voor door het Hollandsche Indische Gouvernement het Regentschap Probolingo is verkocht, te betalen in tien jaren, bij uitloting, volgens Publicatie van heden, alle zes maanden met vijftig duizend Rijksdaalders zilver geld, en zulks onder speciaal verband der Landen Probolingo, Besoekie en Panaroekan, en garantie van het voorschreven Indische Gouvernement.

Batavia den 3den van Wintermaand 1810.

GEZIEN.

Translation:

Part of the sum of one million Rijksdaalders silver money, for which the Dutch Indian Government sold the Probolingo Regent, to be paid in ten years, according to today's Publication, all six months with fifty thousand Rijksdaalders silver money, and this under special association of the provinces Probolingo, Besoekie and Panaroekan, and a guarantee from the prescribed Indian Government.

Behind "N °" is filled in ink with the number of the note, as well as in a blank space in the middle of the first line of the Malay part. Below, are the four signatures described above; bottom left under "SEEN." is the signature of Chassé.

Furthermore, a stamp was printed in the lower left with red ink with the decorative letters LN above 1810 within a pearl circle. A similar stamp, but with the face value of the ticket (1000 to 100) above the decorative letters LN and without the year, is printed twice next to each other on the top of the back of the ticket. On this stamp, however, the image is applied inwards, so that the print shows the letters, numbers, and pearls as recesses in a red field. The intertwined decorative letters LN, the initials of the King of Holland, have exactly the same shape as on the copper money from Surabaya from 1810.

At least as interesting as the common features are the differences that distinguish the notes from each other. As with other Indian issues, the government had apparently been very concerned that notes of lower value would be fraudulently converted into higher denominations. After all, on every note the value was printed in two places only, apart from the two stamps on the back. Probably for that reason, the denominations show many typographical differences so that they can be clearly distinguished from each other even when the text has been tampered with. The most striking differences between the various denominations are the following:

1. The size of the banknotes – those from 1000 to 300 Rds are 24 to 25 cm wide by 19 to 20 cm; those from 200 and 100 Rds are approximately 19 x 17.5 to 20.5 cm.
2. The color of the top two lines of Dutch text – the top line (Litt ...) is printed in red on the banknotes of 1000 and 500 Rds, but the second line is on those of 400 to 100 Rds (Zegge ...) red. The word "GEZIEN." is red on all notes, the remaining text is printed in black.
3. The size of the letters — the Dutch text is printed with a font size that decreases in two steps at the 1000 and 500 Rds, the 400 and 300, and the 200 and 100 Rds. The Malay text does not have this distinction, but in the letters of the word "GEZIEN." is again a variation where the font size is always one step smaller on the 1000, the 500, the 400 and 300, and the 200 and 100 Rds.
4. The paragraph with Dutch text is made up of 8 lines for the 1000 and 500 Rds, 7 lines for the 400 and 300 Rds, and 5 lines for the 200 and 100 Rds. The Malay text always has 7 lines.
5. The value in the top right is expressed in "Rijksd." for the 1000 and 500 Rds, but in full in "Rijksdaalders" for the four lower values.
6. The height of the frame decreases from 1000 to 100 Rds and has a different size for all denominations.
7. The shape of the frame, which is made up of separate characters in the stamp (which can usually be distinguished separately in the printed devices) changes shape – with the 1000 Rds the characters form a single line, with the 500, 300, and 100 Rds a triple line, and with the 400 and 200 Rds a row of brackets with the point outwards. Sometimes corner pieces are applied, namely with the 1000 and 100 Rds on the two upper corners, with the 500 Rds on all four corners and with the 300 Rds on three corners (bottom right missing). Furthermore, the upper edge of the 1000 Rds in the middle shows a small triangular ornament – that of the 400 Rds two "superscript" stars, and that of the 200 Rds two "subscript" stars plus one "subscript" star on each side edge.

The following Probolingo banknotes were available for research:

19 copies of the Dutch Numismatic Collection (NNC) in Amsterdam, two complete series in private collections (PC-1 and PC-2) and one single copy in private possession from MPO auction 36 (2012) lot 5481. In addition, the notes shown in the aforementioned catalogs have been examined. The list below gives as source the collection, possibly with inventory number, or the catalog (KUKI = Handjaja, ON = Uno then Nanang) with catalog number.

There often appears to be written text on the Probolingo notes. It is nice to see that there are examples divided among present owners that, in view of the similarities of the notes, would have previously belonged to the same owner.

Sometimes the two serial numbers on the front are fully written in text, as in No. 16 stands for "(Zegge) N° 16". The owner has noted down his own name or company name a number of times. With a number of notes, there are inscriptions on the reverse side about their lottery and exchange, sometimes quite extensive. A few notes that were exchanged in 1817 and 1818 also state the amount paid out: per 100 national denominators nominal value (of 48 stuivers) 160 Indian guilders (fixed in 30 stuivers in 1817) were given.

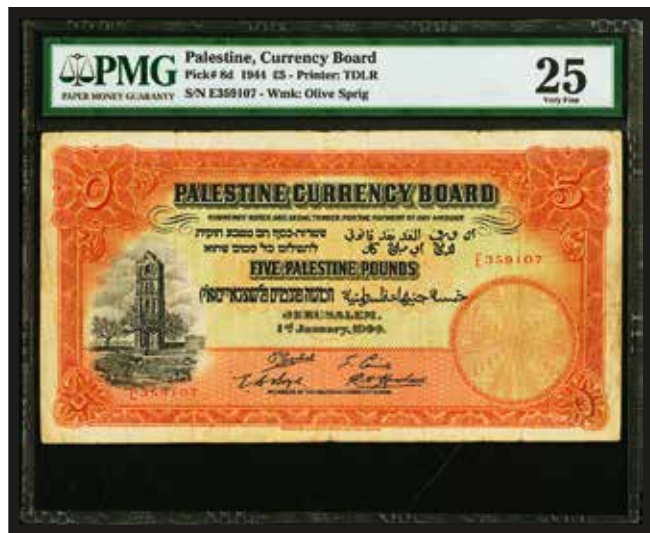

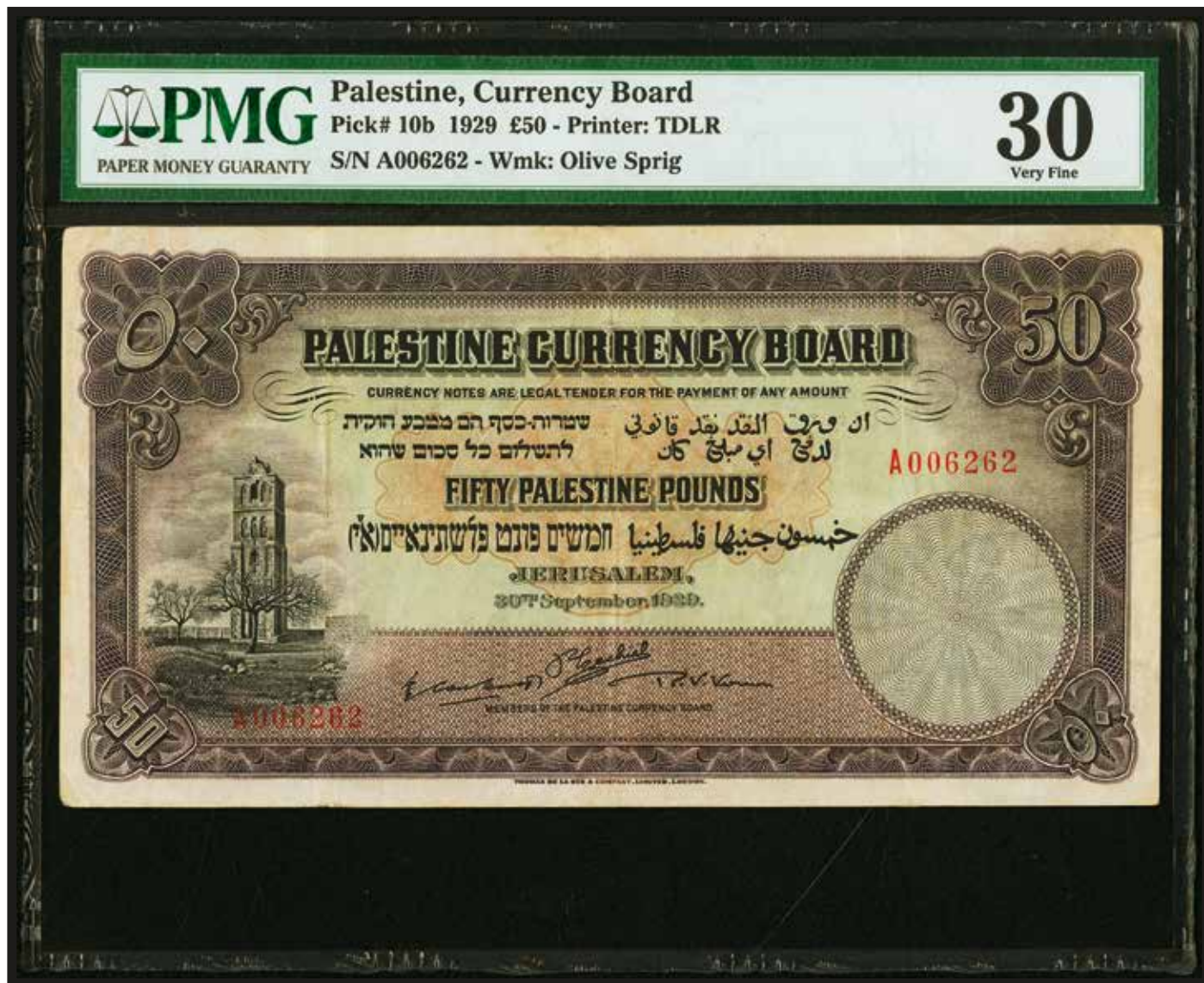

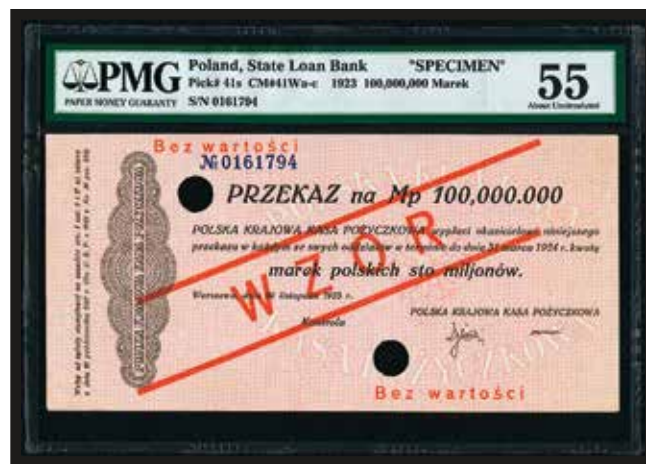

This was most likely a bad decision, because the Bank of England had decided to scrap the Gold Standard, and negatively influenced the SARB, and therefore his ultimate legacy. At the time of his retirement however, 1932 dated notes had already been printed, and had to be amended to fit the end date of his governorship. The E/12 prefix is the only prefix that saw this manual change of date. Interestingly, only 800,000 had been printed, and the additional 200,000 could be corrected to resemble the correct date. Because of the shift in currency backing, demand for small denomination notes were great, and not many of them survived. This is the highest graded example of only two on the PMG Population Report. We have not offered this type before, but the last time it crossed the auction circuit a Very Fine 20 sold for just under \$2,500 in 2013. Rare, and a chance not to be missed.

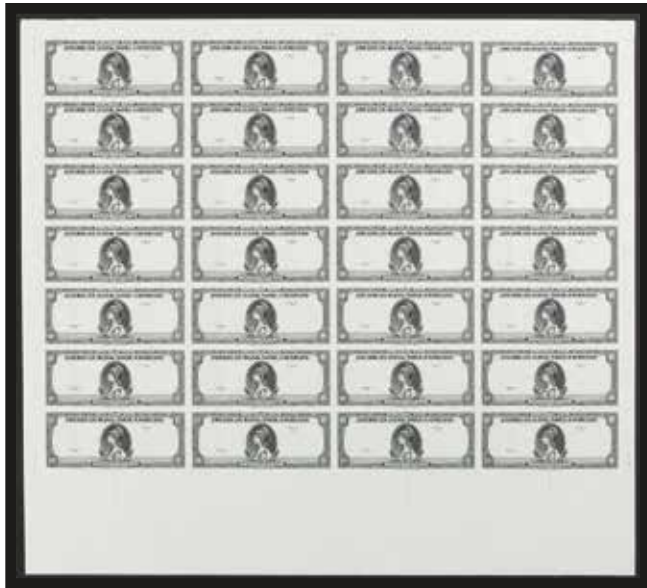

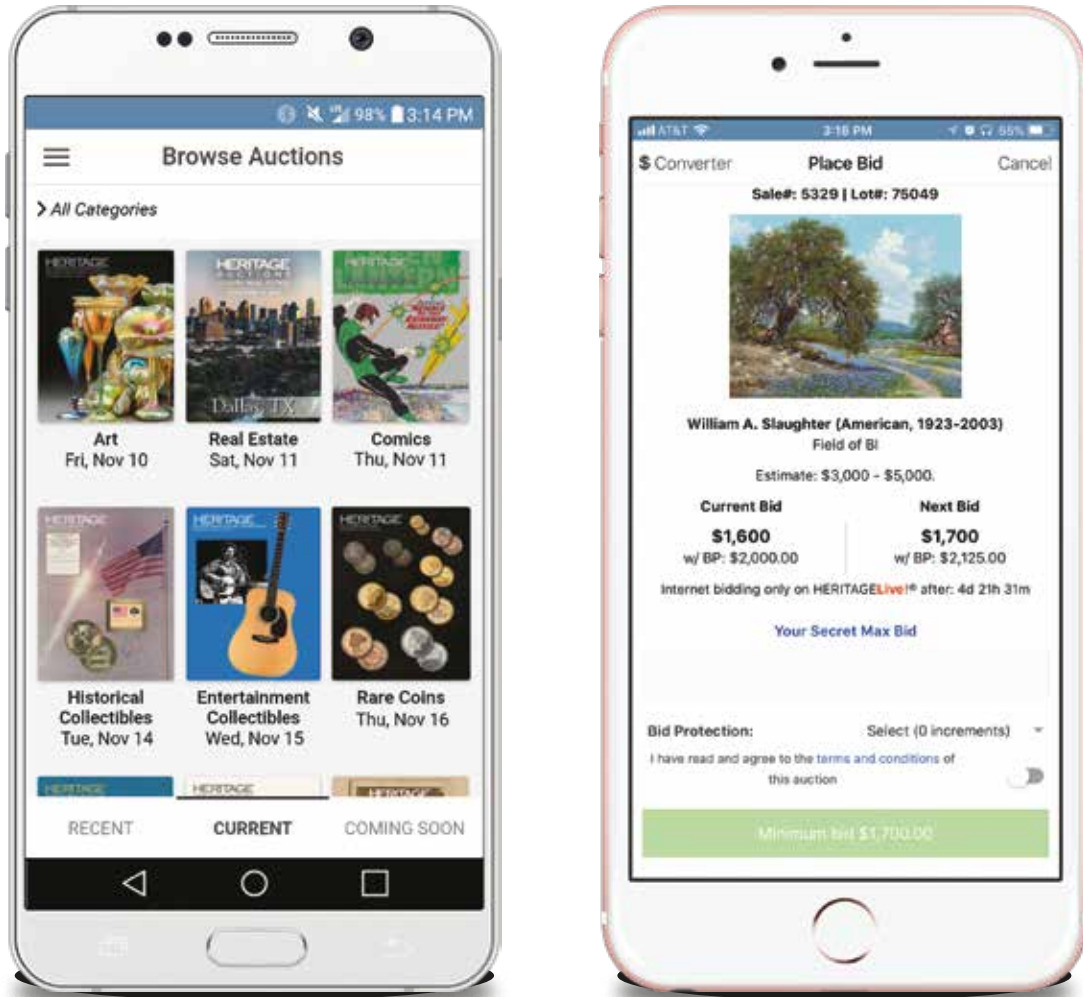
