ASIA MINOR, Uncertain. Gaius Sosius(?). Circa 38 BC. Æ. Sosius was governor of Syria in 38 BC. Antony supported Herod the Great against his rival Antigonus, and Josephus describes how Sosius commanded the Roman forces in support of Herod's claim. Sosius captured the island and town of Aradus in 38 BC and Jerusalem in July of 37 BC, for which he was acclaimed Imperator. Josephus notes that he was about to allow the soldiers to loot the fallen city and slay its inhabitants, when Herod intervened. Herod asked if the Romans, by emptying the city of money and men, had a mind to leave him to become king of a desert, and paid the troops a donative instead, with Sosius himself receiving a "most royal bounty". Sosius called the defeated king the feminine name "Antigona" and imprisoned him for Antony to execute later. In 36 BC Sosius assisted Octavian and Agrippa against Sextus Pompey and afterward probably stayed in Rome, where he celebrated a triumph in Rome in 34 BC and was consul along with Domitius Ahenobarbus in 32 BC. During his consulship, he rebuilt the Temple of Apollo, which had been constructed in 431 BC. He introduced a measure in the Senate to censure Octavian, but this was vetoed by a tribune. As war between Octavian and Antony approached, Sosius fled Octavian and Rome along with some 300 senators. At Actium in 31 BC, Sosius commanded the left wing of Antony's naval forces. This wing of heavy ships entered the battle first, but was overwhelmed by the smaller, faster ships of Agrippa, commander of Octavian's fleet. Meanwhile, Cleopatra, and then Antony, escaped through the opening created by the movement. Sosius fought on, surrendered and was spared by Octavian. 

During the third century AD, an especially strong rivalry existed between Tarsus and Anazarbus, as each considered itself to be the most important city in Cilicia. The appearance of the demiourgos crown on the local coinage, whether by itself, or as an adornment of the emperor's bust, was the clearest indication of imperial preference. Here Caracalla wears both the crown and the chiton of the demiourgos, or public worker, who oversaw the operation of regional festivals and games. The mature portrait on this coin indicates it was struck late in his reign, perhaps during his journey through the eastern provinces in 214/15 AD while preparing to fight the Parthians. Caracalla's favoritism toward Tarsus carried into the reign of Elagabalus (see lot 806 below). By the last year of Elagabalus' reign, however, imperial preference shifted to rival Anazarbus. Elagabalus' fickle change of heart, however, did not long endure, as Severus Alexander show that by the time of the Persian campaign of 232 AD, Tarsus had recovered its earlier accolades. It is notable that the inscription on reverse consists of two twelve-syllable metric iambic verses. Sebastos (Greek: σεβαστός, "venerable one", plural σεβαστοί, sebastoi) was an honorific used by the ancient Greeks to render the Roman imperial title of Augustus. The female form of the title was sebaste ($\sigma\epsilon\beta\alpha\sigma\tau\eta$). From the late 11th century on, during the Komnenian period, it and variants derived from it, like sebastokrator, protosebastos, panhypersebastos, and sebastohypertatos, formed the basis of a new system of court titles for the Byzantine Empire. The parakoimomenos (Greek: παρακοιμώμενος, literally "the one who sleeps beside [the emperor's chamber]") was a Byzantine court position, usually reserved for eunuchs. The position's proximity to the emperors guaranteed its holders influence and power, and many of them, especially in the 9th and 10th centuries, functioned as the Byzantine Empire's chief ministers. The title was used anachronistically by various Byzantine writers for prominent eunuch court officials all the way back to Euphratas under Constantine the Great (reigned 306-337), the notorious Chrysaphius under Theodosius II (r. 408-450), or an unnamed holder under Emperor Maurice (r. 582-602). However, it was most probably created only later in the 7th century, and is first attested securely only under Leo IV the Khazar (r. 775 -780), when the chronicler Theophanes the Confessor records the existence of a "koubikoularios and parakoimomenos". In the beginning, it was a modest office, given to those koubikoularioi (from Latin cubicularius, denoting the eunuch servants of the emperor's "sacred bedchamber" or sacrum cubiculum) who were tasked with sleeping outside the emperor's chamber during the night as a security measure. As evidenced by seals from the 7th and 8th centuries, it was usually combined with other palace functions, such as the epi tes trapezes, and its holders held lowly dignities such as ostiarios. It is possible that in the cases where several coemperors reigned at the same time, a parakoimomenos would be assigned to each. From the mid-9th century, however, the office grew in importance, outstripping its nominal superior, the praipositos, until it came to be regarded as the highest post reserved for eunuchs, with its holders raised to the dignity of patrikios. Over the next two centuries, many of its holders were able to use their proximity to the imperial person to exercise considerable political influence. Some of these men, exceptionally, were not eunuchs. During the reigns of weak or uninterested emperors, holders of the title parakoimomenos, such as Samonas, Joseph Bringas and Basil Lekapenos, functioned as chief ministers, while Basil the Macedonian (r. 867-886) was able to use this position to eventually usurp the throne from Michael III (r.



842-867). By the 11th century, the parakoimomenos had assumed most of the old administrative functions of the praipositos as well. The post continued to be important in the 11th century, but seems to have declined in the 12th, when it also began to be regularly awarded—possibly as a noble title rather than an active function-to non-eunuchs as well. The post survived in the Empire of Nicaea (1204–1261) and into the Palaiologan period, where it was divided in two: the parakoimomenos tes sphendones (παρακοιμώμενος της σφενδόνης) and the parakoimōmenos tou koitōnos (παρακοιμώμενος τοῦ κοιτῶνος). The parakoimōmenos tou koitōnos retained the duties of supervising the koiton (the imperial bedchamber), assisted by the prokathēmenos tou koitonos (προκαθήμενος τοῦ κοιτῶνος) and commanding the chamberlains (κοιτωνάριοι, koitōnarioi) and pages (παιδόπουλοι, paidopouloi), while the parakoimōmenos tēs sphendonēs who was entrusted with keeping the sphendone, the ring with the emperor's personal seal, used to seal his private correspondence to his family. In the absence of the protostrator, they were also charged with carrying the emperor's sword. At the same time, their holders ceased to be palace eunuchs, but were important noblemen and administrators; by the 14th century, the title of parakoimomenos became essentially an honorific dignity. Note: Theriac or theriaca is a medical concoction originally formulated by the Greeks in the 1st century AD and widely adopted in the ancient world as far away as Persia, China and Indiavia the trading links of the Silk Route. It was an alexipharmic, or antidote, considered a panacea, for which it could serve as a synonym: in the 16th century Adam Lonicer wrote that garlic was the rustic's theriac or Heal-All. The word theriac comes from the Greek term θηριακή (thēriakē), a feminine adjective signifying "pertaining to animals", from θηρίον (thērion), "wild animal, beast". The ancient bestiaries included information-often fanciful-about dangerous beasts and their bites. When cane sugar was an exotic Eastern commodity, the English recommended the sugar-based treacle as an antidote against poison, originally applied as a salve. By extension, treacle could be applied to any healing property: in the Middle Ages the treacle (i.e.healing) well at Binsey was a place of pilgrimage. Norman Cantor observes that the remedy was homeopathic in its supposed effect, following the principle of "the hair of the dog," in which a concoction containing some of the poisonous (it was thought) flesh of the serpent would be a sovereign remedy against the creature's venom: in his book on medicine, Henry of Grosmont, 1st Duke of Lancaster wrote that "the treacle is made of poison so that it can destroy other poisons". Thinking by analogy, Henry Grosmont also thought of theriac as a moral curative, the medicine "to make a man reject the poisonous sin which has entered into his soul." Since the plague, and notably the Black Death, was believed to have been sent by God as a punishment for sin and had its origins in pestilential serpents that poisoned the rivers, theriac was a particularly appropriate remedy or therapeutic. By contrast, Christiane Fabbri argues[11] that theriac, which very frequently contained opium, actually did have palliative effect against pain and reduced coughing and diarrhea (cf. Wikipaedia). In 1098 he was murdered in Edessa, when the First Crusade had arrived, and was succeeded by Baldwin of Boulogne, the later king of Jerusalem. A very important seal of great historical interest! (cf. Concerning the dignity of Proedros (Greek: πρόεδρος, "president"), that was a senior Byzantine court and ecclesiastic title in the 10th to mid-12th centuries. The female form of the title is proedrissa (προέδρισσα). The title was created in the 960s by Nikephoros II Phokas and was first awarded to Basil Lekapenos, the eunuch parakoimomenos. It was placed very high in the court hierarchy, coming immediately below the position of the zostē patrikia and before the magistros, meaning that it was the most senior non-imperial title open to males. The title apparently continued to be restricted to eunuchs until the mid-11th century, when it was opened up to the wider aristocracy and extensively awarded. The holder of this dignity was also the president of the Senate (ὑ πρόεδρος τῆς συγκλήτου), and the term proedros was often used to denote precedence in other offices, e.g. proedros of the notarioifor the protonotarios. The title was widely awarded in the 11th century, after it was opened up to non-eunuchs, prompting the creation of the protoproedros (πρωτοπρόεδρος, "first proedros") to distinguish the most senior amongst its holders. The title, along with most of the middle Byzantine court nomenclature, fell into gradual disuse in the Komnenian period, and disappeared in the latter 12th century. According to the De Ceremoniis (I.97) of Emperor Constantine VII Porphyrogennetos (r. 913–959), the clothing and insignia of the proedros in the 960s were: "a rose-colored and gold-embroidered tunic, a gemencrusted belt, and a white chlamys [cloak] trimmed with golden bands and with two gold tablia [square patches] and decoration of ivy leaves." 





ARMENIA, Cilician Armenia. Royal. Hetoum II. 1289-1293, 1295-1296, and 1301-1305. BI Denier . Upon the death of his father Levon II, Hetoum II inherited a country balancing fragilely between the friendly relationship with the Christian Europeans and Byzantine Empire to the far west, the constant aggression of the Sultanate of Rum to the near west, the vassal relationship with the Mongol Empire to the east, and the ongoing attacks of the Mamluks of Egypt to the south. In 1292, the Mamluk aggression forced Hetoum to abandon some cities in order to stave off further invasion. Following these omnipresent diplomatic problems, Hetoum abdicated the following year and entered a monastery, leaving his brother Toros III as king.As the political situation continued to deteriorate. Toros asked Hetoum to resume his role as king in 1295 in order to aid in the renewal of an alliance with the Mongols. With this important task completed, Hetoum returned to Armenia in 1296 to discover that a marital alliance with the Byzantine emperor Michael IX Palaeologus had been offered. Accompanying Toros and their sister Rita to Constantinople, Hetoum left their brother Smpad as regent in their absence. During this time, however, Smpad, along with the help of yet another brother, Gosdantin I, usurped the throne, having Hetoum and Toros captured and imprisoned upon their return. Having Hetoum partially blinded and Toros murdered, Smpad was later betrayed by Gosdantin, who placed himself upon the throne, imprisoned Smpad, and released Hetoum.After recovering at least partially from his injuries, Hetoum deposed Gosdantin, exiling his treacherous brother to Constantinople, and retired yet again to a monastery, though continuing in administrative affairs as regent for Toros' son Levon III. Matters once again deteriorated in 1307, however, as Hetoum attended a banquet with Levon and other Armenian nobleman in Anazarba, all of whom were massacred by a group of Mongol soldiers under the command of the general Bilarghu. Upon their deaths, Oshin, yet another brother to Hetoum, became the fifth son of Levon II to succeed to the Armenian throne.
